# SCHOOL STRUCTURE FOR SEPTEMBER 2020

The process of creating class lists for September 2020 will begin shortly. The first step in this process is to determine class organization, grades JK through eight, meeting the current criteria

of Board, Ministry and contract guidelines. As a school board, we are awaiting further details from the Minister of Education regarding school structuring parameters in September across the province of Ontario.

However, as per our regular practice, each student will be individually discussed and placed, taking into consideration individual needs. Your child will be placed where the staff feels will be the best learning environment for the student. Our goal is to establish balanced classes to provide effective teaching/learning groups which will benefit all children in each class. Teachers will virtually meet to carefully consider the following criteria:

- Learning Styles

- Academic Abilities

- Social Groupings

- Balance of Males/Females

- Behavioural Needs

- Special Education

- English as a Second Language Needs

- Previous Placement in a combined grade

I know that you can appreciate that determining the best and most functional class groupings possible is a task which requires much thought and careful planning. Accepting parental requests for specific teachers, classes or peers would **not** be in the best interest of all students in the school, as it could restrict school staff from forming the most ideal classroom groupings. The teachers who have been working with the students all year know them well, and they will make the determination of placement in their best interest.

On the behalf of the staff, I thank you as we greatly appreciate your anticipated cooperation in trusting us to make the best decision for your child.
